Digital Workshops



We are pleased to announce that we have teamed up with The Bureau, the volunteers centre in Glossop to provide Digital Workshops at the practice for our patients. These workshops are to support patients to access NHS Digital services and Apps such as the NHS App which allows patients to order and track their prescription requests, see results online and other services. The NHS App is the quickest way for patients to order prescriptions

and check when it has been sent to their chemist of choice. If you would like to access one of these workshops please contact the practice to request a referral.

Measles

Measles is one of the most contagious diseases known and cases are currently rising across the country.

Measles is a serious illness, with one in five children who get the disease having to be admitted to hospital for treatment. Measles is not just a childhood disease and can be serious at any age. If caught during pregnancy it can be



very serious causing stillbirth, miscarriage and low birth weight

The best way to protect you and your family against measles is to have 2 doses of the MMR vaccine and this gives life-long protection. The first dose is given around a child's first birthday and the second dose given at around three years and four months. However, anyone can catch up at any age on any missed doses and it's never too late to protect yourself. If you think you have missed one or both doses please contact the practice to arrange an appointment with one of our practice nurses. If you have previously had the measles infection you may also have immunity.

Spring Covid Vaccinations



From 22nd April patients over 75 years old, and those with an immunosuppressed condition from 6 months old, will be eligible for a Spring Covid vaccine. Clinics will be set up at the Practice when supplies of vaccines are available and we will be contacting eligible patients inviting them to book.

Carers

GP Practices are under huge pressure and has been in crisis for many years due to neglect from successive governments

Did you know?

- GP Practices only account for 5% of the NHS staff
- GP Practices receive 7-8% of the overall NHS budget
- GP Practices see 90% of all NHS contacts
- The value of the GP contract has eroded by £620million compared to 5 years ago
- At Sett Valley Medical Centre we have provided 50,000 appointments in the last year by GPs, nurses, HCAs and pharmacists
- GP Practices are not fully funded to pass on NHS pay rises that are communicated via the media
